***Partner Activities***

Heirloom vegetable and herb garden planning, cultivation, maintenance, and harvest activities with opportunities to learn about soil care, composting, and plant varieties used by pioneer emigrants. Seed saving and packaging for sale at the Interpretive Center gift shop. (Funds provide for garden needs.)

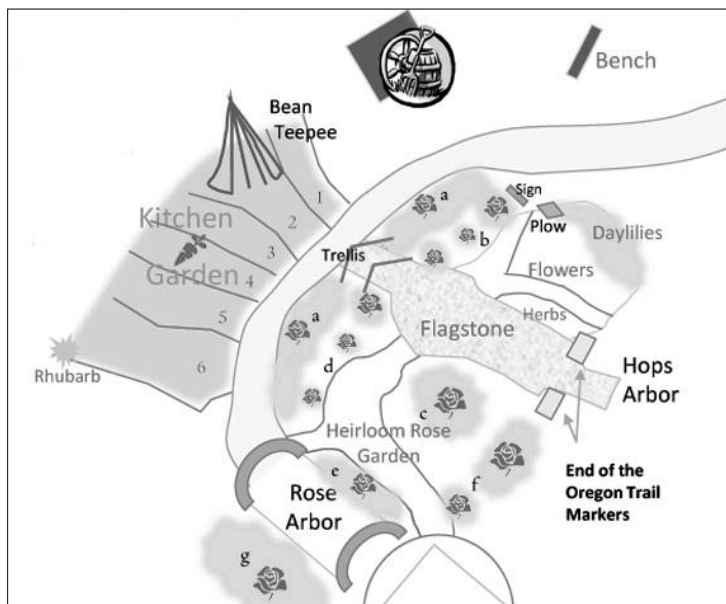
Heirloom rose garden maintenance with opportunities to learn about pruning techniques and companion plantings. Explore the history of our county through the stories about these hardy plants.

Also under cultivation are several heirloom apple trees, grapes and hops. Learn how these plants enhanced the lives of our pioneer forefathers.

***Program Activities***

Partnership with Interpretive Center to provide educational talks and activities to school groups as requested. This provides an opportunity to work with young people on an occasional basis (mostly spring field trips for 4<sup>th</sup> graders) and sometimes talks to adult groups on specifically requested subjects.

*\*Heirloom plants are open pollinated plants, once commonly grown from seed. They come back true-to-type; in other words, the next generation of offspring directly reflects its parenting generation. An Heirloom Rose is one that existed before the introduction of the first Modern Rose, 'la France', in 1867. These roses are also known as heritage, historic, old roses, antique and old garden roses.*
