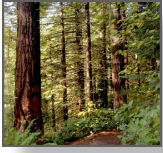




Chapter Outing: Monday, July 11, 1 pm - 3 pm Field Trip to Hoyt Arboretum

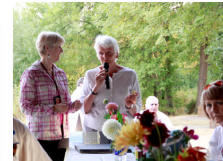
