May 11, 2020: Bee-Friendly Gardening Practices – *Gail Langellotto, Oregon State University Garden Ecology Lab*



Although Master Gardeners are trained in university research, nearly all of the gardening advice they dispense to home gardeners are derived from agricultural research. This is because research funding concentrates in commercial crops while there is little to no money to support research in gardens.

Bucking this trend, Dr. Gail Langellotto of Oregon State University formed the Garden Ecology Lab in 2016. This talk draws from a 3-year study of Portland area gardens. It will review the plants and practices that have been shown to promote native bee abundance and diversity in home gardens. It will also highlight the importance of urban and suburban gardens to bee conservation efforts, and small changes that any gardener can make to benefit bees.
