

The garden at the End of the Oregon Trail is a demo garden showcasing plants that were used in the 1860's. They grow and harvest seeds from the garden much as the pioneers did. Seed-saving and trading was a big part of pioneer gardening culture. In the summer you will see many vegetables with colorful seed heads ripening in the sun. ## Our Chapter Investment in Garden Research and Education is Paying off

At the recent Joy of Gardening conference held on July 12-13 in Corvallis, Clackamas County Master Gardener Association (CCMGA) was recognized during a keynote speech on garden research.

In the past 12 months, CCMGA provided crucial support in disseminating garden research from the OSU Garden Ecology Lab. They included:

- A 2023 Gray & Norrene Thompson Grant that paid for a pilot project that produced 4 Garden Ecology Lab (GEL) briefs, designed to make garden research user-friendly. Borrowing ideas from the 10-Minute University handouts, each brief is 2 pages and uses a standardized format, beginning with the research question, followed by the result, and concluding with potential applications in the garden.
- 10-Minute University™ editors (Karen Day, Justin Dune, Laura Eyer, Shi-Yi Liu, Sherry Sheng) reviewed each draft and offered ideas for improving clarity and relevance.
- 10-Minute University™ team began sharing GEL briefs in newsletters, on the [10-Minute University webpage](#) (with support from Sharon Andrews) and in webinars where research findings fit the topic.
- CCMGA funded the design of six more Garden Ecology Lab briefs, bringing the total to 10.

Culminating these activities was a keynote presentation on “Ten Cool Things We Learned from Garden Research”, delivered by Dr. Gail Langellotto and Sherry Sheng, to more than 200 attendees. Written evaluations are not yet available, but preliminary indications were overwhelmingly positive. Many MGs said that they are excited to share these new research-based information with others.

### What's next?

The Garden Ecology Lab continues their work, with student researchers working under the direction of Dr. Gail Langellotto. The lab currently supports two graduate students and five undergraduate students, costing about \$135,000 a year. OSU Graduate School covers graduate student tuition, leaving over \$100,000 needed from private contributions.

In 2023, Sherry Sheng set up the Oregon Garden Research Fund for this purpose. She pledged personal funds and began to raise the rest. In the past few months, a group of individuals and organizations have joined the Garden Ecology League. League members meet three times a year to learn about the latest research and to provide feedback. In addition, they make an annual donation of \$500 or more.

The League roster includes CCMGA, Benton Co. Master Gardeners, Lane Co. Master Gardeners, Oregon Master Gardener Association, Hardy Plant Society of Oregon, and many individuals.
